Mission: Answer House, operated by Middlesex Human Service Agency, provides community-based shelter, nutrition, and recovery programs that help individuals and families build self-sufficiency and overcome homelessness, hunger, and addiction. For admission criteria and availability, call central intake at 781-296-2653.

Description of programs: This 3–6 month residential recovery program for adult men (18+) operates as a working house, with residents paying \$100 per week once they begin working. The program includes AA/NA meetings on-site and in the community, AAWOL, and relapse-prevention/sober-living skills. Residents receive group sessions, individual counseling, financial education, and life-skills training, supported by evidence-based therapies such as CBT, DBT, motivational interviewing, and 12-step facilitation. The program provides referrals to medical, behavioral health, employment, legal, and educational resources, along with direct employment assistance. Transition planning supports movement into stable, sober housing and includes discharge planning and aftercare to promote long-term recovery.

Mission: Julie's Family Learning Program (JFLP) is a welcoming, inclusive space that provides free educational programs and supportive services to help develop strong, successful families and adults. Since 1974, JFLP has been dedicated to empowering parents to recognize their strengths and utilize their know-how to stabilize and transform their family life. Educational programs for parents focus on a mix of life skills and adult basic education coursework in preparation for attaining high school equivalency. In 2019, JFLP expanded its mission to include all underserved learners, 16 years and older, who seek flexible opportunities to attain the educational credentials and workplace skills crucial to meeting their life goals.

Description of programs: JFLP operates three interconnected programs:

- Adult Basic Education serves anyone age 16+ who is interested in academic classes in preparation for a high school credential. This is a flexible, part-time program with a hybrid option.
- Family Development offers an intensive curriculum of Adult Basic Education and life management skills to low-income mothers and non-binary parents. All learners in both programs have access to digital literacy classes, individual tutoring, career/next step services, case management, and many supportive services.
- Children's Services offers on-site, state-licensed early education with infant, toddler, and pre-school classrooms (for 3 months to 5 years) for the children of the program's adult learners. While parents strive to reach their goals, their children reach their own age-appropriate milestones. Julie's also serves children from the community through its free universal Boston Pre-K program (ages 3 & 4), and occasionally, through vouchers, in its other classrooms.
