- -reduced the size of the project by removing a building and replacing it with a pavilion which will consist of restrooms, business, restaurants etc.

- -some the heights of buildings are reduced
- -increased open space and civic social space
- -increased residential building account
- -20% onsite affordable housing
- -\$36 million transportation options
- -\$18 million of resilience funding to reduced flood
- -Climate Ready Boston in their plans
- -Work Force Training Center will be available to the public and will be built early
 - Partnered with Boston Construction Apprenticeship
 - Strong outreach to South Boston and Dorchester
 - Nonprofit workforce training
 - Education Programming for youth will be available
